

[Boyden, Anna Sarah Vaughn]

MRS. WILLIAM BOYDEN

Mr. and Mrs. G. A. Vaughn went to Canton last week to attend the funeral of Mrs. William Boyden, a sister of Mr. Vaughn, an account of whose death is taken from a Canton paper:

Anna Sarah Vaughn, wife of William H. Boyden, died at her home, Park street, Friday morning, following a long and wearing illness. Mrs. Boyden underwent an operation several months ago and her condition has been almost hopeless since. Funeral services were conducted at her late home Sunday afternoon at 2, Dr. James H. Payson officiating. Burial was made at Evergreen.

Anna Sarah Vaughn was born in the town of Pierrepont, on Oct. 24, 1862, the daughter of the late George Vaughn. She was one of a large family of children. At an early age she fitted herself for teaching and taught several terms of school in the town of Pierrepont. In 1888 she was joined in marriage with William H. Boyden, at the time Express Agent at Canton, and they have been residents of this village since that time.

Mrs. Boyden was a member of the First Universalist Church and the L. A. S. [Ladies Aid Society] of that society and while in health was an active worker and devoted member of the society. Several years ago she devoted herself to the welfare of young boys, and formed a boys club which was given the use of two rooms at her home as club rooms, all this being done to keep the boys off the streets.

Mrs. Boyden leaves besides her husband, a son and daughter, Augustus H. Boyden, of Pyrites and Mrs. Leroy Garner, of Canton. The following brothers and sisters also remain: G .A. Vaughn, of Chateaugay; Elmer Vaughn, of Glens Falls; Mrs. Margaret Cota, of Canton; Mrs. Lottie Shortell, of Newark, N. Y.; Mrs. Susie Tredo, of Hartford, Conn.; Mrs. Nancy Patnode and Mrs. Rena Otis, of Lake Clear. All were present at the funeral.
