Bridgewater, May 7.—Dr. Madison Eugene Boynton, who has been one of the most familiar figures in this village for the last decade, died yesterday afternoon at the home of Mrs. Mattie Hackley. Dr. Boynton caught a cold and was about the house until Sunday, when his indisposition rapidly developed into more than a slight illness. Madison Eugene Boynton was born August 9, 1841, in Cato Four Corners, N.Y., and later removed with his parents, Dr. and Mrs. Boynton, to Clinton. He graduated from Hamilton College in the class of 1864, and from the medical college at Ann Arbor, Mich., a few years later. He practiced medicine in the south. In 1878 in Utica he married Miss Delia R. Cowles, an aunt of Mrs. Mattie Hackley, now the widow of his nephew. Dr. and Mrs. Boynton resided in Camden, Ala., for 23 years. She died Feb. 26, 1901. He came north after the death of his wife. He was a member of the Universalist Church. Nephews and nieces are the nearest surviving relatives.
