Dr. M. E. Brackett

At the time of the death of Dr. M. E. Brackett, of Clarendon, several weeks ago a brief announcement of the fact appeared in the Standard, with the intention on the part of both the friends and the publisher to have a more extended notice the following week. Through an oversight such notice was not furnished. To partially make up for such omission the following has been sent us:

Dr. M. E. Brackett, a lifelong resident of Clarendon, and a practicing physician of his native town for more than one-third of a century, died at his home January 2, 1904. With his demise our town loses a well known and useful man. His skill as a physician was great, his success is known afar, and his profession recognized in him a genius for medicine. But none will miss him more than the poor, whom he often served without money or price, and to whom he always went in the order of his calls. The community has suffered a real loss, and the memory of his good deeds will live long after him. The funeral was held at the Universalist church under the direction of the I.O.O.F. The Clarendon Tent of the K.O.T.M. also attended in a body. Rev. Lewis H. Robinson, pastor of the deceased [and minister of the Universalist Church] was the officiating clergyman.
