Charles B. Brattig, War Veteran, 34

Charles B. Brattig, 34, of 657 E. 21st St., a former army lieutenant and a veteran of actions in Normandy, northern France, the Ardennes, the Rhineland and Central Europe with General Patton's 3d Army, died yesterday in the St. Albans Veterans Hospital.

Mr. Brattig had five battle stars on his campaign ribbon. He entered the army in December, 1942, and was overseas from Feb. 28, 1944 to Sept. 22, 1945, serving as ordinance supply officer. Returning home on terminal leave he received his discharge in December.

Born in Tarrytown, Mr. Brattig spent his boyhood in Glendale, where he was active in Boy Scout work. He was graduated from City College in 1932 and for a number of years was employed as a warehouse supervisor for General Motors' Chevrolet Division. In 1939 he was married to Elizabeth Voris and the couple lived for three years in Hartford, Conn., and Boston before he was inducted.

Besides his widow he leaves twin daughters, Barbara Voris and Susan Dolph Brattig; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Brattig, and a sister, Mrs. Theodore Neher of Bellrose. Funeral services will be held at 8 p.m. tomorrow at the Fairchild Chapel, 86 Lefferts Place, the Rev. Dr. Cornelius Greenway, pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, officiating. Burial with military honors will take place Wednesday in the National Cemetery, Pinelawn.
