FUNERAL FOR A. T. BROWN CONDUCTED

City officials, friends and business associates today attended funeral services for Alexander T. Brown, Syracuse industrial leader and inventor, who died Thursday. Services took place at 2:30 o'clock at the Brown home, 726 W. Onondaga st.

Chancellor Charles Wesley Flint of Syracuse University, where Mr. Brown was long a member of the board of trustees, and Rev. Dr. Frederick W. Betts, pastor of First Universalist Church, officiated. Burial was in Oakwood Cemetery.
