Mrs. Nathan Brown—

Mrs. Emma E. [Eunice] Brown, wife of Nathan Brown, died yesterday at home on Cavalli street. She had been ill for some time. Mrs. Brown was born in Fairfield in 1857 and was the daughter of Jacob Hendrix and Mary Feeter, who were old settlers of that section. She had spent most of her life in this neighborhood, except for a few years in San Francisco. Mr. and Mrs. Brown were in that city at the time of the earthquake, the former being in charge of a lumber mill there. They remained in 'Frisco about three years after the disaster, Mr. Brown's work being connected to a large extent with the rebuilding of that city, and then returned to the East. The couple married 36 years ago. Mrs. Brown was the last of a large family of children, and is survived only by her husband. She was possessed of a most admirable character, being a kind friend and neighbor who enjoyed the love and esteem of her many acquaintances. The funeral will be held from the home of the deceased at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon, the Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton of the Universalist Church officiating. Interment will be made in the Porter Cemetery in the town of Salisbury.
