Samuel Seeber Brown

After a very brief illness, Samuel Seeber Brown died at his home, 902 N. Madison avenue, Pasadena, Cal., Saturday, July 15, 1905, at 7 p. m. Mr. Brown was in his usual health until Thursday night preceding his death. He retired at 9:30 and a few hours later he complained of severe pain from what he thought was indigestion. Home remedies were applied but he felt no relief and continued to grow worse. The doctors pronounced it a severe bilious attack and despite medical aid he still grew worse. On Friday it seemed to develop into pneumonia and he lingered thus until Saturday. Mr. Brown and his nephew from Los Angeles took a trip to the foothills on Thursday afternoon and it was thought that he took cold, causing the illness.

Samuel Seeber Brown was born in Fleming on May 7, 1857, and was the son of Menzo A. Brown, deceased, and Sarah Smith. Mr. Brown was married to Madora E. Olmsted, of Weedsport, N. Y., October 25, 1899. Mr. Brown had made many friends by his kind and genial disposition. He was a member of the First Universalist church of Auburn. He is survived by a wife, mother, one brother, Edgar A. Brown, of Pasadena, a sister, Mrs. Ida P. Coleman, of Los Angeles, and another sister Mrs. Elman F. Campbell, of this city.

The funeral was held from his late home, on Monday afternoon, July 17, at 3 o'clock. Rev. S. Dunham, pastor of the First Universalist Church of Pasadena, conducted the services, and interment was at Mountain cemetery.
