Nearly her entire life has been spent here, with the exception of one year in Cleveland, O., when first married, and three years in Morrisville, 1868 to 1871. She was educated in the school of her home town and at Oxford Academy, Oxford, N.Y. Since the death of her husband, Feb. 26, 1902, she had made her home with her son, F. H. Brownell. In early life she united with the Universalist Church here and had since been staunch in her religion, working with untiring devotion for her church. For years she was a teacher of the primary class in the Sunday School, and was a regular attendant at church services as long as she was able.
