Mrs. Buckle, 76, Dies; Native of Herkimer

Mrs. Lula Buckle, 76, a former resident of Herkimer died Saturday morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Frank Parese, 19 Park Avenue, Dolgeville, where she had resided for the past 3½ years. She had been in ill health for the past several months.

Mrs. Buckle was born in Herkimer on Feb. 15, 1887, the daughter of Chauncey and Julia Service Rice. In October 1906 she was united in marriage to Frank Buckle. His death occurred several years ago. Mrs. Buckle took a keen interest in the history of New York State especially Herkimer County and had read widely on this subject. She performed expert needlework, hooked rugs being a specialty.

She attended the Universalist Church in Herkimer and Dolgeville. Surviving are the daughters [sic], Mrs. Frank Parese, Dolgeville; one uncle, John Service of DeKalb Junction and several cousins.
