

[Bullion, Caroline Clapsaddle]

SCHUYLER LAKE

Monday, May 28, 1906, Caroline Clapsaddle, widow of John Bullion, entered into rest at the home of her son, Geo. D. Bullion, at the Bullion House. Mrs. Bullion was a daughter of John and Barbara Helmer Clapsaddle, and was born in the town of German Flatts, March 17, 1819. A large part of her life has been spent at Richfield, but for the past three years her home has been with the son, where she died. Mrs. Bullion was a staunch Universalist and the names of her husband and herself were the first to be enrolled on the church register at Richfield Springs, and her increasing years have not prevented her being a regular attendant of the church here. She had been in her usual health until Monday morning, when after a hearty breakfast she was stricken with apoplexy and died about 6 p.m. of the same day, apparently without suffering. Those who knew Mrs. Bullion intimately affirm that she had a lovely Christian character, and was never known to speak ill of anyone. She leaves three sons, George D. of this place, Charles of Richfield, and Frank of Mohawk. The funeral was held yesterday at 1 o'clock. Interment in the family lot at Cullen [Bloomfield Cemetery in Richfield Springs].
