The death of Ida M. Bellinger Bullion, wife of Clarke Bullion, occurred at her home in this village, on the morning of December 25th after an illness of ten days, due to complications. Mrs. Bullion was the daughter of Norman and Anna Baxter Bellinger and was born in Little Falls, September 16, 1863. Her marriage to Mr. Bullion took place November 26, 1882. All her life had been spent in Little Falls and in this vicinity. Twelve years ago, Mr. Bullion retired from work, and he and Mrs. Bullion left their farm near Cullen and moved to their home on Church street. Mrs. Bullion was a member of the Universalist church and deeply interested in its welfare. She was loved by a large circle of friends and will be greatly missed. She possessed a sweet and charitable character, and was ever performing a kind deed for some one, ever mindful of others. A son, Harry, died in March, 1911, while attending Columbia University. To the devoted husband, deep sympathy is extended.

The funeral was held Thursday afternoon at the home, the Rev. W. Skeels of the Universalist church of Herkimer conducting the service, and the interment was in Lake View cemetery.
