JOHN FONDA BULLIS

John Fonda Bullis died on Saturday, November 25, at 7 o'clock p.m. at the home in which he and his brother Henry have lived since 1857.

Previous to one o'clock in the afternoon, Mr. Bullis had been in his usual health, at which time he sustained a paralytic stroke and remained unconscious until his death. His brothers are Henry, Miael, Lewis and James, all of Canton, and his sisters are Misses Nettie and Angeline Bullis, of Canton, and Miss Marie Bullis and Mrs. A. U. Hutchins, of Corfu, N.Y. While all have the sympathy of the whole community, especial sympathy is felt for Mr. Henry Bullis, with whom the deceased had made his home so many years. The funeral service will be at his late residence at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, Rev. G. M. Gerrish, of the Universalist church officiating.
