Death of Mrs. Burrington

Mrs. Elizabeth M. Burrington, wife of Rev. L. M. Burrington, pastor of the Universalist church in this village, after long and protracted suffering, died on Friday evening last, at the age of 49 years and 7 months. She had been an invalid most of the time since she came here with her husband in September last, and consequently the people had become very little acquainted with her. She was a woman of rare worth, fitted to adorn any station. She was a native of Woodstock, Vt., was educated in the Institute there, and was also for several years principal of the female department. She was a woman of refined and aesthetic tastes and her influence was ennobling in the communities where she dwelt. She was a real help-meet of her husband, to whom she was married twenty-three years ago, in the performance of his duties as pastor of the churches in Reading, Worcester, and North Adams, Mass., Troy, N.Y., and St. Paul, Minn., whence he removed to Fort Plain. She leaves a husband, a son of fourteen years, a widowed mother, a sister and two brothers, one a physician residing in Vermont.

Her funeral was attended at the church on Monday of this week by Rev. Dr. J. S. [John Stebbins] Lee, of Canton, N.Y., her former friend, teacher and pastor, aided by Rev. T. D. [Theodore Dwight] Cook, of Utica, Rev. E. W. [Elhanan Winchester] Fuller, of Fordsbush, and Rev. J. J. [Jay Jenkins] Brayton, of Frankfort.
