FUNERAL OF AARON BUTTS WILL BE HELD TUESDAY RETIRED BAKER, IN BUSINESS HER MANY YEARS, PASSES AWAY.

The funeral of Aaron Butts, well known retired baker of this city, who passed away at 12:20 Sunday morning at the residence of his brother-in-law, J. W. Baldwin, 750 Ives street, will be held at 1 Tuesday afternoon from the Baldwin reidence. The Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist church, will officiate. Interment will be in the family plot in Black River cemetery.

Mr. Butts had been in poor health during the past seven months due to a complication of ailments, including liver trouble, and during the past five months had been forced to remain in bed. He was 63 years and seven months old.

He was born in the town of Wilna and for many years conducted a farm there, coming to this city about 29 years ago. He had since resided here. He engaged in the bakery business here, conducting the Black River Bakery, first in Arsenal street, between Arsenal and Meadow and later in State street under the firm name of Butts & Baldwin, disposing of the bakery about ten years ago. Since retiring from active occupation he had spent some time at his home at Star Lake, being there the greater part of each summer.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Fannie Gould Butts, formerly of the town of Wilna; three brothers, Philip and Alonzo Butts, both of Carthage, and Joel Butts of Michigan, and a sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Van Amber of Carthage.
