Louise Franklin Cady

The death of Louise Franklin Cady, a former resident of Richfield Springs, occurred at her home in Iliion on September 5th, after a short illness. Mrs. Cady was graduated from Richfield Springs High School in the class of 1901.

She was born in Middletown [Middleville, Herkimer Co.], daughter of Benjamin Franklin and Lucy Ward Franklin. She had been a resident of Iliion about 30 years, and was married to Clarence Ball who died in 1914. She married Beltran Cady at Herkimer in 1922.

Mrs. Cady was a niece of the late Dr. H. A. Ward of this village.

She was a member of the Universalist Church at Herkimer and the American Legion Auxiliary.

Survivors are her husband, Beltran Cady; a son, Clarence Franklin Ball; two brothers, Samuel Ward Franklin, Newark, N.J., and Kenneth S. Franklin, Lynbrook, N.J.

She was an active member of the Mission Circle and served the church school as a teacher and officer. She was always eager to work and give to her church. She is survived by her husband, Beltram Cady and her son, Franklin [Ball, son of her first husband Clarence Ball]; also by two brothers. The memorial service was conducted at her home by Robert A. Babcock on September 7.
