Mrs. Callahan Dies at 86 in Syracuse

Mrs. Annie A. Callahan, 86, a resident of Binghamton more than 75 years, died early this morning in Syracuse.

She was the widow of John H. Callahan, proprietor of a hardware store at 57 Court Street for about 60 years. Mrs. Callahan died at the home of a son, John C. Callahan, with whom she had lived for the last few years.

She was a charter member of Binghamton First Universalist Church. The body will be brought to Binghamton later this week. The funeral is expected to take place at the Universalist Church. Burial will be in the family plot in Floral Park Cemetery.

Mrs. Callahan was born in Sharon, Mass. She came to Binghamton with her brother, the late Cassius M. Clapp, who operated a retail shoe store on what is now the site of the J. C. Penney Co.

She was a descendant of the Warren and Clapp families of Massachusetts. The youngest of 14 children, she was a lineal descendant of Maj. Gen. Joseph Warren, who was killed in the Battle of Bunker Hill. Surviving are a daughter, Miss Ethel B. Callahan, professor of mathematics at Hartwick College, Oneonta; two sons, Donald E. of 13 Chestnut Street, a teacher at Vestal Central School, and John C. of Syracuse, and four granddaughters, Miss Nancy and Miss Susan Callahan of Syracuse and Miss Jean and Miss Audrey Callahan of Binghamton.
