L. May Cameron, retired Syracuse public school principal and sister of Vernon A. Cameron of Richfield Springs, died in Syracuse Sunday July 2nd, at the age of 78.

Miss Cameron became associated with the public school system of Syracuse 40 years ago as a teacher assigned to an old school near the site of the present Merrick school. When Merrick school was erected, she became its first principal.

A native of Delphi, Miss Cameron was the daughter of Addison and Persis Ingraham Cameron, who were early settlers of Pompey.

She had long been a member of Betts Memorial Universalist Church in Syracuse.

Surviving Miss Cameron are three brothers, Rush Cameron of Syracuse, Robert R. Cameron of Rochester and Vernon A. Cameron of Richfield Springs; two nephews, Burr G. Cameron of Endicott and Robert D. Cameron of Fairmount; three nieces, Mrs. Charles A. Reid of Rochester, Mrs. George Kress of Tacoma, Wash., and Mrs. D. W. Wright of Zanesville, O.

Funeral services were conducted at the undertaking establishment of W.A. Fancher Wednesday with the Reverend Ellsworth C. Reamon, pastor of Betts Memorial Church, officiating. Burial was made in Woodlawn Cemetery.
