Mrs. Mary Williams Campbell died at her home on Elm street in Cooperstown, Sunday evening, March 20th, after an illness of several months duration from heart disease.

Mary Williams was born in Cooperstown, Dec. 21, 1841, the only daughter of the late Isaac K. Williams, whom the older residents of the village will remember as a long time faithful employee in the Freeman's Journal office, and Maria Kellogg Williams. She was married to James G. Campbell in 1910, who died in 1920.

Mrs. Campbell was one of the oldest members of the Universalist church to which she gave a most unswerving loyalty and devotion. She was also a valued member of the Ladies' Auxiliary, S.O.V., No. 18, having been its organist for the past seven years.

There are left no immediate relatives, but there is a wide circle of friends to whom the news of her death will bring a feeling of deep sorrow.

The funeral was held last Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, from her late home, the Rev. Charles Kramer officiating, with interment in the family plot at Pierstown.
