The death of Mrs. Almeda Barnum Caney, widow of the late Irving Caney, occurred at 5:30 o'clock Sunday morning at the Mary Imogene Bassett Hospital, where she had been a patient for the past six weeks following a period of invalidism extending over a period of nearly two years. In her death Cooperstown loses a woman of lovable Christian character whose unselfish thoughtfulness of others and untiring devotion to her home and her church will long live in the memories of her many friends. Her untiring care of and complete devotion to her stepfather, Robert L. Davidson, with whom she lived following the early death of her mother, and down to his death in 1926 was an outstanding example of her spirit.

Mrs. Caney, who was the daughter of Linus and Sabrina Jeanette (Pierce) Barnum, was born in the town of Middlefield January 5, 1860, and practically all her life was spent in Cooperstown. She was united in marriage June 30, 1887 with Irving Caney of Richfield Springs, whose death occurred in January, 1911. She was an active and devoted member of the Universalist church from childhood.
