MRS. A. J. CANFIELD

The widow of the Rev. A. J. [Andrew Jackson] Canfield, who died in 1908, and was long the pastor of the Universalist Church of Our Father [First Universalist Society of Brooklyn], died Tuesday, October 25, at her home in Warren, Mass. She was born there, her parents being Colonel Bardon and Dulcinea Pepper Cowee. From her youth she was interested in religious work and her father's house was always open to the Universalist missionaries. She married the Rev. A. J. Canfield in 1862, and was a great help to him in his various pastorates in Brooklyn, Concord, N.H.; Utica, N.Y.; Chelsea, Mass.; Chicago, III., and Worcester, Mass. Mrs. Canfield leaves a daughter, Mrs. M. L. Chase of St. Louis; two sons, Dr. C. A. Canfield of Albany and John B. Canfield of Warren, and a sister, Mrs. O. I. Darling of Warren. At her funeral, held at Warren, the officiating clergymen were the Rev. Dr. [DeWitt C.] Tomlinson and the Rev. W. J. Taylor of Worcester, and the Rev. T. C. Richards of Warren.
