MRS. ADELIA E. CASE OF DEXTER DIES SUDDENLY Stricken During the Night—In Poor Health For Some Time. (Special to The Times).

Dexter, Jan. 10.—Mrs. Adelia E. Case, wife of W. Campbell Case, died at her home in this village about 2:45 a.m. today, aged 61 years and one month. Mrs. Case had been in failing health for several months. Her condition was not regarded as critical, however. Tuesday evening she went out on the porch of her home to deliver a message to a neighbor. She was taken critically ill in the night and a physician was summoned. Death was due to a complication of diseases.

She was born in the town of Brownville, Dec. 6, 1856, daughter of the late William and Hannah Winnie Jackson, and had always lived in this locality. She had resided the greater part of her life in this village.

She is survived by her husband, W. Campbell Case, who owns considerable property in this locality; one daughter, Mrs. Albert Warren of Glen Park; and two brothers, Charles Jackson of Limerick and William Jackson of Pillar Point, and one sister, Mrs. Harry [Mary] Allison of Limerick.

The funeral will be held from the family home at 1, Friday afternoon. Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls' Universalist church, Watertown, will officiate. Interment will be made in Dexter cemetery.
