DEATHS.

At Howlet[t] Hill, Onondaga county, May 13th, Mrs. ALICE, wife of Giles Case, Esq., and mother-in-law of Rev. N. [Nelson] Brown, [husband of Rebecca Paige Case Brown], aged 51 years and 6 months.
