HERBERT L. CASE

His eighty-seventh year was the last year for Herbert L. Case whose death occurred in his home in Canandaigua on March 13. He was always the center of interest at the meetings of the Ontario Association [of Universalists] and his extemporaneous talks on Universalism were always an inspiration. Most of his life was spent on a fruit farm in Bristol until 1899 when he made his residence in Canandaigua. He then devoted himself to the bee industry and became an authority in this work. He was one of the organizers of the Alliance Mutual Fire Insurance Company. The memorial service at his home was conducted by the Revs. Harry M. Wright [of Bristol] and C. Clare Blauvelt [of Rochester] on March 15. His survivors are his widow; two sons, Roy H. Case of Seattle and Earl F. Case of Rochester; a daughter, Mrs. W. E. Topes of Hopewell and an adopted daughter, Evelyn Moore of Rochester.
