P.W. Case, 93, Retired Farmer, Dies

P. W. Case, 93, of 47 North Main St., died today in Thompson Hospital following a long illness. Mr. Case was a retired Bristol and Canandaigua area farmer. He was born in Bristol Aug. 11, 1876, the son of the late Ralph O. and Arethusa Park Case. He served for 27 years as justice of the peace for the town of Canandaigua. On March 8, 1899, he married the former Ethel Montagne. They began farming in Allen Hill and in 1917 moved to the Bristol Road, Canandaigua where they lived until 1918. He had been a Grange member for 64 years, having been affiliated with the Academy, West Bloomfield and Canandaigua organizations, and was a past Grange master. He was also a member of the [former] Universalist Church of Baptist Hill for many years. He was secretary for the Federal Land Bank of Massachusetts. His wife died in 1964. Survivors are a daughter, Mrs. Harold (Freda) Johnson, a granddaughter, Mrs. Mary Douglass and a grandson, John C. Johnson, all of Canandaigua, and seven great-grandchildren. Johnson Funeral Home where funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2 p.m. Burial will be in the Evergreen Cemetery at the convenience of the family.
