—E. B. Chace<sup>1</sup>, a well-known resident of this city, died suddenly in London yesterday morning. Mr. Chace's home was at No. 157 Lake avenue. He had been abroad several months and was accompanied by his wife. Mr. Chace was for many years one of the leading lumber merchants of this city. He was alderman from 1876 to 1879, inclusive, and was for several years a member of the Board of Health. He was a member of the Board of Managers of the State Industrial School, having been appointed to that place by Alonzo B. Cornell, then Governor of the State.
