Frank E. Chaddock, Well Known Le Roy Citizen, Dies at 85

Le Roy, Feb. 22. Frank E. Chaddock, a prominent resident of this village for the past 22 years, died last evening at his home, 36 Clay Street. His death was hastened by an accident which he sustained while visiting the Bailey's Mill cemetery, four miles south of Le Roy, ten days ago. He fell, fracturing his right hip, and had since failed steadily.

Chaddock, a son of Suel and Eleanor Stanard Chaddock, was born in Pavilion Aug. 17, 1844. Prior to his removal to this village, he was engaged in farming. In 1897 he became connected with the Citizens' Bank and following its merger with the Bank of Le Roy in 1902 continued as cashier. In 1907 he resigned as cashier and was succeeded by the late William C. Donnan, being then elected [to] the office of vice-president which he held at the time of his death.

Much of the development of Machpelah Cemetery and its strong financial condition was due to the efforts of Mr. Chaddock, who served 39 years as a trustee and the various offices including president of its association until one and a half years ago, when he gave up his active connection. He was a member of the Universalist Church, but since the passing of that society in Le Roy had attended the Presbyterian Church. He was a contributory member of the Oatka Hose Company and for years participated in the annual whist tournaments.

Mr. Chaddock was twice married. On April 7, 1868 he married Miss Aledia E. Stevens of Bergen, who died on July 2, 1888. His second wife was Miss Antoinette Sprague of Le Roy, to whom he was married on May 15, 1890 and who died on October 25, 1925. Two daughters born of the first union died in their youth and the nearest survivors are several cousins residing in the West.

The Rev. Clara Morgan of Hornell, a Universalist minister, assisted by the Rev. Evan M. Jones, pastor of the Presbyterian church, will conduct the funeral services, which will be held at Mr. Chaddock's late residence at 2:30 o'clock on Sunday afternoon. The interment will be in Machpela cemetery.
