DESCENDANT OF HAMILTON Mrs. J. D. Chaffee, Relative of Noted Statesman, Dies

Mrs. Louisa Broadwell Chaffee, wife of Dr. David Chaffee, passed away yesterday morning at the family home, No. 50 South Union street, at the age of 83 years. Mrs. Chaffee was related to Alexander Hamilton. She was a daughter of Henry [and Mary] Broadwell, of Fulton, who was a prominent architect, building contractor and manufacturer. Broadwell avenue in Fulton was laid out through his land and named after him.

Mrs. Chaffee was married to Dr. David J. Chaffee on March 4, 1863, by Rev. Royal R. Pullman [Universalist] at Fulton. She was the last survivor of a family of four sisters [the others having been Jane, Ann and Josephine]. Mrs. Chaffee was fond of music, and she and her sisters were widely known in their younger days for their singing. Besides her husband, Mrs. Chaffee leaves her daughter, Cora A. C. Boddy, and a granddaughter, Florence C. Boddy.
