She has left a kind and devoted husband, and other near and dear friends, to whom she was strongly attached, to mourn her loss. But they sorrow not as those without hope. It was her wish to have a Universalist clergyman attend her funeral, but owing to the absence of our clergyman, none could be obtained, and the Rev. Dr. Parsons, Methodist, preached on the occasion, to whom many thanks are due, for the kind and christian spirit he manifested.
