Mohawk, Sept. 28—The death of Mrs. Clarissa S. Clemens, wife of the late Isaac Clemens, occurred last night at her home on the Shoemaker Hill Road, after a long illness.

Mrs. Clements was a daughter of the late Caleb Sweet and Mary Piper of Boonville where she was born Jan. (9?), 1836, and is in her 92d year. Her father was a direct descendant of the bonesetter Sweet that first settled in Rhode Island.
