DEATHS.

In Madison, Madison co., N.Y., June 23d, Mr. ISAAC COE, in the 69th year of his age.

The deceased had an attack of the Epilepsy several years since, which greatly impaired his constitution. He recovered in part from the effects of his sickness, and continued to enjoy comfortable health, until January last, when he began to decline, and continued gradually to fail until about a week previous to his death, when he had a paralytic shock [stroke] which is supposed to have terminated his existence.

Father Coe was one of the oldest residents in Madison. He was a consistent, understanding Universalist. He lived the principles of that Gospel which breathes "peace on earth and good will to all men," and died under the consoling and sustaining influence of that faith which robs death of its sting, the grave of its victory, and eternity of its gloom—leaving a wife and seven children to mourn the departure of a kind husband and exemplary father.

His funeral was attended on the 24th, and a discourse, applicable to the occasion, delivered by the writer, in the Presbyterian Church at Madison Centre, which was kindly opened for the reception of a large and respectable audience, who assembled to sympathize with the afflicted relatives, and pay the last sad tribute of respect to one who had become endeared to them by his many virtues.
