Mrs. Compton, 85, Dies After Illness at Lyndonville

MIDDLEPORT—Mrs. Susie Van Derwarker Compton, 85, of 3 Washington ST., widow of Lee Compton, died Sunday (Feb. 3, 1957) at the home of her daughter, Mrs. L. E. Collins, S. Main St., Lyndonville, where she had been ill for the last six months.

Born Feb. 7, 1872, in the Town of Hartland, Mrs. Compton was the daughter of Lyman and Faye Shippen Van Derwarker. She was a lifelong resident of this vicinity.
