NATHAN B. CONKLIN

Huntington, L.I., December 10—Nathan B. Conklin, who died at his home here on Sunday night, was a native and a life long resident of this town. His father, George Wood Conklin, was identified with commercial pursuits in New York City and later conducted a general store at the homestead at Huntington Harbor. He died in 1859. Nathan B. Conklin was one of five children, of who two survive—Mrs. Henrietta Platt and Joseph K. Conklin of this place. He was born November 23, 1822. He was a hard working, progressive farmer. He was married on his twenty-fifth birthday, November 23, 1847, to Henrietta Sammis of this place. Three children were born to them and, with Mrs. Conklin, all survive their father. They are Miss Lavinia H. and George S. Conklin and Evelyn M., wife of Frank Irwin, all of Huntington. Mr. Conklin's mother died in 1891, aged nearly 100.

Mr. Conklin took a lively interest in educational matters and was a member of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union School for twelve years. He was a Republican in politics and a member of the Universalist Church. The funeral will be held from his late residence this afternoon, the Rev. Charles W. Tomlinson officiating.
