## RODNEY C. COURSER, NATIVE OF STOCKHOLM, DIED AT 81 YEARS

Buckton—Funeral services for Rodney C. Courser, 81, of 44-A Western Avenue, Lynn, Mass, a native of Buckton, were held Monday, Mar. 6 from the Richardson Funeral Home in Lynn, Mass. Mr. Courser had died unexpectedly in the Lynn Hospital after suffering a heart attack.

The Rev. Fenwick L. Lovett Jr., D.D., of the First Universalist Church officiated.

Burial was in Woodlawn Cemetery, Nashua, N.H., where Dr. Lovett conducted the service.

Mr. Courser was born Aug. 10, 1879 on the Smith Road in Buckton, Town of Stockholm, the son of Homer and Ellen Phippen Courser. In 1905 at the age of 25, he left Buckton and went to Nashua, N.H., where he had taken employment.

On June 5, 1912, Mr. Courser and Jessie Holmes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Holmes of Buckton were married in Nashua. They made their home in Lynn, N.H. Mr. Courser was associated with the Whiting Milk Company in Boston for many years and was employed in Lynn and Salem, Mass., by the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company for 25 years as a stock clerk and repairman. He and Mrs. Courser resided in Lynn, Mass. for the last 43 years.

Mr. Courser was a member of the Telephone Company Pioneers and of the Men's Class of the First Universalist Church.

Surviving in addition to Mrs. Courser are two daughters, Miss [B?]eryl E. Courser at home and Mrs. Muriel H. Craig of Lynn, Mass.; and a cousin, Mrs. Gayle Kent of Buckton. Mr. Courser's only brother, Ambrose Courser, of Winthrop died in November of 1946.
