MRS. JAMES COY DIES; PROMINENT CHURCH WORKER

Mrs. Naomi E. Heydon Coy, one of the best known workers in Universalist Church circles in this boro, died on Thursday at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. Elbert N. Payne, Springfield, Mass. She was 82 years old.

Mrs. Coy was very prominently identified with the work of the Church of Good Tidings, Stuyvesant-ave and Madison-st. She was beloved by the members of the church and on the occasion of her 80th birthday many persons from this boro traveled to Rowayton, Conn., to extend their congratulations. Mrs. Coy formerly resided at 702 Halsey-st. and had lived in this boro for 30 years. She was born in Manhattan, the daughter of the late William and Mary Heydon and was the widow of James Coy, a civil engineer who helped to build several railroads in South America. She was educated at Clinton Seminary and was a classmate of the daughter of the Rev. Dr. James M. Pullman, for many years pastor of the Fourth Universalist Church in Manhattan.

She is survived by a son, Edwin S. Coy, an architect, and her daughter, Mrs. Payne. The funeral services were held last night at 8 o'clock in the Church of Good Tidings. Interment will be in Greenwood.
