SARAH MOSES COYKENDALL IS DEAD  
Former Postmaster of Whitesville Died at Hornell Sunday  
Morning at Home of Niece Where She Was spending Winter.

Sarah Moses Coykendall, daughter of the late John G. and Jessie Ward Moses, died at the home of her niece Mrs. Orville Matthews at Hornell, where she was spending the winter, Sunday morning, Feb'y 9, 1930. She had been in failing health for the past six months but had been about the house as usual the evening previous to her passing. She was 75 years of age.

Cause of death was heart disease.

Deceased was born in West Union but many years of her life were spent in Whitesville, where for some six years she was postmaster under the Wilson administration; also at Harrison Valley, Pa. In December of 1884 she married Geo. M. Coykendall, who with a son that died in infancy preceded her in death.

Mrs. Coykendall was a generous and public-spirited woman, an honorary member of the Woman's Civic Club, and an attendant at the Universalist church. She is survived by one brother Cyrus Moses of Stanards, also eleven nieces and nephews.

The funeral was held Wednesday, Feb'y 12th, from the Universalist church, Whitesville, just eight days from the service for her late sister, Mary Halsey. Burial was in Hillside Cemetery, Rev. Dr. Wm. E. M. Todd of Woodbury Universalist Church of Hornell, officiating.
