Homer Craver, aged 36, died at White Lake at 10 a.m. Sunday. He was a son of Michael and Lucinda Craver of Point Rock and was born there. His early life was spent at Point Rock. Later for six years he was bookkeeper at the Oneida County Home here. He was afterward employed by the F. M. Orton Company for about a year, and nine years ago he removed to White Lake. He was formerly the proprietor of Smith's Hotel at McKeever and for three years he was keeper of the state dam at Woodhull. For some time past he had been residing on the Ott farm at White Lake. On April 21, 1904, he was married to Miss Jennie M. Smith, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. C. Smith, 817 Floyd avenue, Rome. He is survived by his wife, parents, two sisters, Mrs. John Harris of Pittsburgh, Pa., [and] Miss Belva Craver of Point Rock, and two brothers, Elmer of Vernon and Howard of Norwich. He was a member of Rome Council, No. 150, Royal Arcanum. Last fall he was elected assessor of the town of Forestport.
