## CROSS

Perry friends were deeply grieved on Tuesday to learn of the death of Ledyard Cuyler Cross of this place, at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick H. Cross, of 4 Fairview Heights, Rochester, on Tuesday afternoon. Death was caused by cerebro-meningitis.

Mr. Cross had ben ill for several days, suffering from a gathering in his ear and other ailments, but his condition was not considered critical. Mr. Cross, who was traveling for Cross Brothers of Rochester, was taken ill while in that city and went to the home of his parents, where he expected to remain temporarily, until he was sufficiently improved to come home. Mrs. Cross was called there last week and remained for a few days, leaving him apparently considerably improved, with the expectation that he would be able to come home within a few days. He was taken suddenly worse on Monday night of this week and Mrs. Cross went to Rochester on Tuesday morning, being at his bedside when he passed away. Mr. Cross was aged 32 years. He was a man of exemplary habits, devoted to his family, and made friends among all who knew him. He was a member of the Universalist Church of Perry and a consistent christian.

He is survived by his wife, Maud Durland Brown, and two children, Carolyn and Francis; also by his parents and two sisters, Florence and Dorothy, of Rochester, all of who have the sincere sympathy of many friends in their great bereavement.

Funeral services were held Friday morning at 9:30 o'clock at the home of his parents in Rochester.
