END CAME SUDDENLY Herbert H. Crouch Dropped Dead in Bedroom While Dressing

Arising at 6 o'clock this morning, Herbert H. Crouch, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred [and Sarah Hayden] Crouch of No. 17 Capitol Street, fell to the floor as he started to walk to the dresser and died before medical aid could reach him. Death was due to an acute heart attack.

He was 31 years old and had been a sufferer from heart trouble for a number of years. It did not incapacitate him, however, and he worked yesterday as usual and when he retired last night he made no complaint of feeling ill. He was employed by the Superb Stamp Pad Company in Cottage Street and arose, intending, it is supposed, to go to work today.

Mr. Crouch occupied a sleeping apartment with his father who had preceded him down the stairs. The father heard the young man fall and hastened up the stairs to find him dying. A hurry call was sent to Dr. Allen Baker but death had ensued several minutes before he arrived.

Besides his parents the young man is survived by one brother, Harold Crouch, and one sister, Lillian Crouch, both of this city.

Funeral services will be held at the family home Tuesday afternoon at the convenience of the family. Burial will be at Fort Hill.
