Death of Mrs. Crouch¹

Yesterday morning at 10 o'clock Mrs. Sarah Ann Crouch, wife of Geo. W. Crouch, the well known lumber dealer, breathed her last. Her friends have long feared her death, but while it was not entirely unexpected, it startled all. Mrs. Crouch had been ill for about three years, but was considered dangerous only of late. Mrs. Crouch was a daughter of the late Mr. Joseph Joy, of Brockport, a former resident of this city, and was married to Mr. Crouch in March, 1844. Her age at the time of her death was sixty-one years. She had reared a family of six children, two sons and four daughters, all of whom survive her. Their names are as follows: George W., Frank P., Sarah L., Nellie M., Mrs. James L. [Cornelia M.] Bruff and Mrs. Wallace L. [Celina A.] Hagaman. The funeral will take place from the family residence, 19 Howell street on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
