Theodore Crowell, who died on Thursday night, was one of the oldest residents of the Ninth Ward of this city. He was in his younger days a clerk in the auction house of Wilmerdings & Mount, and after a honorable service with them, he established himself as a weigher, his business being largely confined to teas and China products. For the past 30 years Mr. Crowell was engaged in the warehousing business at Nos. 54 and 55 South-street, and enjoyed the confidence and esteem of all his business associates. He was a staunch Universalist, and for 25 years had been connected with the old Bleecker-Street [Third] Universalist Church. At the time of his death he was the President of its Board of Trustees.
