Samuel H. Curran Dies in Chicago; Boro Churchman
Vice President of Royal Baking Powder Co. Was All Souls Trustee Here

Samuel H. Curran, 59, of 1409 Glenwood Road, vice president of the Royal Baking Powder Company and prominent Flatbush churchman, died yesterday of a brain tumor in the Presbyterian Hospital, Chicago. Word of his death was received here by the Rev. Cornelius Greenway, pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, of which Mr. Curran was vice president of the board of trustees. Mr. Curran had been ill for several months, and six weeks ago went to live with his son, Kenneth J. Curran of 148 Forest Ave., Riverside, Ill. He had been associated for 40 years with the Royal Baking Powder Company and was general production manager of the organization, which is a subsidiary of Standard Brands, Inc.

Mr. Curran was born in Chicago and had lived in this borough for about 25 years. He was graduated from Princeton University in 1896 and took an active part in the affairs of the Princeton Alumni Association. He was chairman of the investment committee of All Souls Church. He also was a member of Montauk Lodge, F. & A. M., and the American Institute of the City of New York. He is survived by his wife and his son and a daughter, Mrs. Earle Willis Lawrence of Charlotte, N. C. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in the chapel of Graceland Cemetery, Chicago.
