PHILO S. CURTIS DEAD

The death, from paralysis, of Philo S. Curtis, the well known boiler manufacturer of Utica, occurred at 10 o'clock Monday morning. He was born in Sauquoit in 1824. Four years later he went to Utica and attended the public school. About 35 years ago he started a foundry and boiler factory on Whitesboro street, and continued that business very successfully, to the time of his death. His wife died about six years ago. He attended the Universalist Church and was a contributor to many benevolent institutions. In politics he was a democrat but never held office. Mr. Curtis was one of the most prominent citizens of Utica. His nearest surviving relative is a nephew, Curtis H. Roberts, who is now in California.
