Perkins; two sisters, Miss Marian Coleman and Mrs. Bertha Hull; one sister-in-law, Mrs. Mary Van Court, who at the advanced age of ninety-five years, was able to attend her funeral; several nieces and nephews.

Her funeral, which was held from the Universalist church on Tuesday, was largely attended by friends in and from out of town, with the Rev. Charles Kramer of Cooperstown officiating, with burial in the village cemetery.
