DEATH OF ANDREW V. DAVIS
He Was an Old and Well Known Welsh Resident

Andrew V. Davis, an aged and highly respected Welsh resident of this city, died at his home, 15 Spring street, at (?) this morning, aged 77 years, 9 months and 18 days.

The deceased was born in Cherry Valley, but at the age of 20 he went to Sherburne, where he resided up to five years ago, when he settled in Chadwicks. Last May he moved in[to] this city, where he resided up to the time of his death.

His occupation was that of a roller coverer in cotton mills.

For about 20 years he had been affected with asthma, but it was not until a week ago that he was forced to take to his bed. He was a Universalist in religion, and it was his earnest endeavor to live the life of a Christian. In politics he was a Republican, but never accepted the political preferment which his friends would have been pleased to give him.

His first wife, Debora Davis, died in 1874, and in 1875 he married Ellen Clements, who survives him. He also leaves a son, Warren Davis o New York Mills, two daughters, Mrs. Jane Rappahannock of this city and Mrs. William Groff of Willowvale, a brother, the Rev. Joel Davis of Earlville and a sister in Cooperstown.

He died as he had lived, quiet and peacefully. He enjoyed the respect of all who knew him, and his demise will be sadly mourned.
