DEATHS.

In Middlesex, Yates county, on the 11th inst., in the 18th year of her age, Mrs. CAROLINE D. DAY, wife of Dr. Fish H. Day, and daughter of Edward Perry, Esq., of that town. Early last spring, Mrs. Day—then Miss Perry—while pursuing her studies in the Female Department of the Liberal Institute at Clinton, was suddenly afflicted by a complete prostration of the nervous system. Subsequently removed to the residence of her parents, she endured for about eight months, a greater amount of suffering than often falls to the lot of any one so young in life. Possessing a gifted mind and an affectionate heart, she was, when in health, the pride of the circle in which she moved; in sickness, the object of the most solicitous sympathy, and in death, of the keenest regrets. Gifted with all the elements of an elevated character, she was pure in life and peaceful in death. On the 15th inst., her remains were removed to a place of public worship, where, among a numerous audience were assembled a large number of her associates, who had loved her in life, and now deeply deplore her early departure.
