SUDDEN DEATH OF CARROLL L. DAY Stricken With Heart Trouble While Transacting Busines

Carroll L. Day, aged 63 years, a well known farmer residing on the west road, west of the city of Cortland, died suddenly at the warehouse of the Farmers' Syndicate in this city, this morning shortly before 11 o'clock. His death was practically instantaneous, the end coming before medical assistance could reach him. Heart trouble was attributed as the cause of his sudden death.

Mr. Day came to Cortland this forenoon with his horse and wagon, going to the Farmers' Syndicate to purchase feed. He had just transacted his business in the warehouse and he was in the act of paying the cashier when he was stricken. A call was immediately sent to Dr. F. F. Sornberger, but the life had departed before the physician reached the place. Mr. Day had been afflicted with heart trouble before, but his sudden and unexpected death this morning came as a great shock to members of his family and friends.

The deceased was born at Hunt's Corners on Oct. (14?), 1858. He was the son of Smith O. and Almira Day. Mr. Day spent his younger life at Hunt's Corners and for approximately 35 years he has resided on the farm on the west road in Cortlandville.

He was a member of the Chicago grange and although he was not a member of any church, he was a Universalist in his belief.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Esther Day; one daughter, Miss Leah A. [Almira] Day, who teaches at the Mansfield State Normal school at Mansfield, Pa., and one sister, Miss Kate E. Day of 19 South Main-st., Homer.

The funeral arrangements have not been completed, but will be announced later.
