MRS. EMILY K. DEAN, ILL 8 YEARS, DIES

Mrs. Emily Kingsbury Dean, 76 years old, died Thursday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Charles Brossman in Indianapolis, Ind.

She was the widow of Thomas Dean of the Dean Bros. Steam Pump Company, who died in 1921. Since 1920 Mrs. Dean had been an invalid.

Born in Hanover, N.H., November 19, 1851, Mrs. Dean spent her early life there. She removed with her parents to Rome, N.Y., where in 1869 she was married. A year later she and Mr. Dean went to Indianapolis where she had since lived.

Mrs. Dean was a charter member of the Propylacum and before the city took over the operation of kindergartens, she was an active worker in kindergartens for poor children of Indianapolis. She was a member of the Universalist Church.

Besides the daughter, Mrs. Brossman, survivors are four sons, Stuart and Ward Dean, both of Indianapolis; Charles Dean of Milwaukee, Wis., and Douglas Dean of Berrien Springs, Mich., and ten grandchildren.

Private funeral services were held at the home of Mrs. Brossman where Mrs. Dean had lived since 1921, at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon. Dr. F. S. C. Wicks, pastor of the All Souls Unitarian Church, was in charge. Burial also was private, in Crown Hill Cemetery.

Mr. and Mrs. Dean were frequent visitors in this village a few year ago, several times spending summers at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Bissell.
