G. B. Dean Dies; Several Months Ill  
Held Various Executive Posts with L. C. Smith Firm

George B. Dean, 92, former tool room superintendent at L.C. Smith & Corona Typewriters, Inc., and for many years active in fraternal circles, died in a convalescent home at 1704 South Salina Street Monday morning after an illness of several months.

Born at Amsterdam, Mr. Dean came to Syracuse 65 years ago. He became associated with the typewriter firm in 1882, and during his 56 years with that company, he had held various executive posts. At the time of his retirement four years ago, he was the oldest employe[e] both in age and point of service.

Active in fraternal circles, Mr. Dean was a member of Syracuse Lodge 501, F. and A. M., and of all the Consistory bodies, including Central City Commandery and the Knights Templar. He was affiliated with Calvary Chapter, O.E.S., Pioneer Council 1, Daughters of America, and Onondaga Council 10, Junior Order of United American Mechanics. He was a member of Betts Memorial Universalist Church.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Elva Morgan Dean, and several grandnieces and grandnephews.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the home, 332 West Newell Street, the Rev. Ellsworth C. Reamon of Betts Memorial Universalist Church officiating. Burial will be in Oakwood Cemetery.
