Death of Peter M. Dederick

Peter M. Dederick, whose serious illness was mentioned in the Republican, died at his home on North Fifth street Tuesday morning. He was 79 years old. He came to this city from High Falls, Greene county, when 19 years of age, learned the trade of carpenter with Henry Avery, and made a specialty of stair building, being employed in that line of work for over twenty years in the Traver planing and finishing mill in this city.

Mr. Dederick was respected as an honest, fearless, conscientious man, who industrious habits and moral courage made him looked up to as an ideal citizen. He was kind and generous, a good neighbor and true friend, and his memory will be cherished by the many who intimately knew him. He is survived by his wife [Augusta Avery Dederick]; two sons, Edward and Harry of this city; four brothers, Samuel, David, Duane and John, of Kiskatom, Greene county, and two sisters, Mrs. George Trumpbhor of Palenville and Mrs. Miller of Kiskatom.
