Tyler T. Dewey Dies Suddenly

Tyler T. Dewey, nearly 73 years of age, carried the milk from his farm, about two miles east of this place, to the Mohawk Condensery Friday morning, returned home, unhitched his horses with the assistance of his brother, Alfred, and walked to the house where he fell, stricken with apoplexy, from which he died Saturday morning without having regained consciousness. Mr. Dewey was apparently enjoying the best of health up to the time he was so unexpectedly taken ill. He was a veteran of the Civil war, being a member of Co. E, Ninth New York Cavalry.

Mr. Dewey was the son of Lester R. and Fanny Patton Dewey. He is survived by a daughter Fanny, wife of M. O. Bement of Buffalo; two sons, Don and Burnett Dewey of this town, and two brothers, Alfred and Lester Dewey, both living in this vicinity. His wife, Ellen Wilcox Dewey, died suddenly last August.

The funeral was held at the house at 1 o'clock, Rev. P. W. Price [Paul W. Price of Titusville, PA] attending.
